In ye name of God Amen. We whose names are underwritten, the loyall subjects of our dread soveraigne Lord King James, by ye grace of God, of Great Britaine, franc, &

Ireland Hing, defender of ye faith, &c.

Raveing undertaken, for ye glorie of God, and advancemente of ye Christian faith and honour of our ting & countrie, a voyage to plant ye first colonie in ye Mortherne parts of Virginia, doe by these presents scientify & mutually in ye presence of God, and one of another, covenant, & combine ourselves together into a Civill body politicit; for our better ordering, & preservation & furtherance of ye ends aforesaid; and by vertue hereof to enacte, constitute and frame such just & equal Lawes, ordinances, Acts, constitutions & offices from time to time, as shall be thought most meete & convenient for ye generall good of ye colonie: unto which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witnes whereof we have hereunder subscribed our names at Cap=Codd ye -11 - of Movember, in ye year of ye raigne of our soveraigne Lord King James of England, france & Ireland ye eighteenth, and of Scotland ye fiftie fourth. Ano Dom. 1620.














